**Question:** Choose a universal symbol (e.g., water, fire, bridges) and brainstorm how it could represent two *different* themes in separate stories.

# 4. Conflict

**Question:** The text mentions "subtle unease" as a tension-building tool. How could you create unease in a mundane scene (e.g., a family dinner) without explicit conflict?

#### 5. Writing Emotion

**Question:** "Show, don't tell" is key to conveying emotion. Rewrite the sentence "He was terrified" using sensory details and actions.

#### 6. Creativity Techniques

**Question:** Try the "I Remember..." exercise aloud with your group. Share one memory that could inspire a story—how might you fictionalize it?

# 7. Integration Challenge

**Question:** Pick one element (worldbuilding, symbolism, or conflict) and explain how it could reinforce the emotional arc of a "Fall and Redemption" story.
